The 115th Annual Conference is now in the history books, as it was the worst conference ever attended by its members. What's it going to take to get our members involved? Those who did attend had a good time. During the conference, it was discussed as to what it's going to take to bring in new members and to get the word out about the IPA. A new committee was formed, "Marketing/Technology Committee" and will report back to the Executive board at their next board meeting. The committee is made up of 7 members. Four from the Blackhawk Division and one member from the Shawnee, Tri-County and North Shore Divisions.

With the conference being over, we are now accepting renewals and new membership applications for 2017. I hope everyone will do their part and sign up at least one new member this year.

Next year's conference is set for September 15th, 16th, 2017 at the Holiday Inn Gurnee Convention Center, Gurnee. It being an election year, anyone wishing to run for an elected office and the State Board, should have either his or her letter of intent into the main office by March 17th, 2017. The nominating Committee will be meeting before the April Executive Board meeting to review the letters of intent received by the main office and make their recommendation's to the board. Any letter received after the March 17th, 2017 date will not be accepted.

Reference to the Sherwood Youth Camp law suit, we are still waiting to see what the Plaintiff has up his sleeve. The First Appellate Court ruled in favor of the Sherwood youth Camp on the Plaintiff's appeal of Judge McGrath's order transferring the case back to Knox County. One of the reasons the Court ruled in our favor is that the Plaintiff failed to file a complete record of what happened in the Trail Court. It's too late now for the Plaintiff to try to supplement the Appeal. The Plaintiff has 30 days to file another motion to have the Court reconsider the case and he could appeal the case to the Illinois Supreme Court. As I receive more information, I will notify the membership.

There are a number pension bills that you should be aware of. The first being HB 1334, this bill pertains to the Chiefs. This would allow a Chief to retire, collect a pension and then be able, to work for another department without giving up his or her pension. BUT, an amendment has been added that revives the language from HB 1320, which would require retired municipal law enforcement officers to suspend their pensions, if they accept a job in another municipality.

HB 1320 is still on the floor and has been re-referred to assignments.

The third bill, if passes, gives investment power of downstate police and firefighter pension funds to the Illinois State Board of Investment in addition to other changes to downstate pensions as a whole.

Other bills of interest:

HB 4349: Evaluation and insured.

SB 3096: Reforms Sexual Assault investigation procedures.

HB 5816: Public safety Officer Privacy. This prohibits a person, business, association or government agency from publicity posting or displaying information of a public safety officer 5 days after the receipt of an officer's written request not to post or display the personal information.

HB6042: Homeland security Appropriation: This would provide that the homeland Security Emergency Preparedness Trust Fund shall be considered always appropriated for the purpose of disbursements, as provided in the Act and shall be paid out and disbursed only as provided herein and shall no at any time, be appropriated or diverted to any other use or purpose.

HB 6191 & HB 6308: Juvenile Court-Delinquency Age: Provides that persons under 21 years of age, (rather than under 18 years of age), who commit offenses are subject to the proceedings under the Act for delinquent minors.

HB 4446: College Admission Inquiries: Prohibits any campus, university to ask about criminal history for admission.

IPA Minutes of the 114th Annual Conference Page 1

President Chris Surdel, called the 115th Annual Conference of the Illinois Police Association to order at 09:30AM, with the Pledge of allegiance to the Flag and a moment of silence for all of our departed brothers and sisters.

Director Ed Hoes read the roll call of officers. Absent was Past President Mike Perry.

A motion was made and seconded to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the 114th Annual Conference. Motion carried.

President Surdel, introduced Mr. Rob Roman, President of Investment Counsel, Incorporated, who gave the investment report. After some discussion, a motion was made and seconded to accept the report as read. As of 2016, the Death Benefit Fund had a return of 8.43%. Motion carried.

Attorney's Report; Ed Pacilli reported that the Appellate Court agreed with the Trial Court and ruled the case should go back to Knox County. CZ Driving Horses still has two weeks to file a motion to reconsider. Ed stated that Cook County had raised the property taxes on the main office in Elmwood Park quite significantly. He is in the process of appealing the property taxes and hopefully have they lowered to something more reasonable. Currently, they are scheduled to be \$19,430.00, as compared to what we paid last year, which was \$10,789.00. Ed will have a report at the next Executive Board Meeting.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the report as read. Motion carried.

Death Benefit Report: Director Ed Hoes reported that since the 114th Annual Conference, there were a total of 69 claims presented before the Committee for their review. 37 claims were approved to be paid out in the amount of \$600.00, totaling \$22,200.00. 20 claims were approved to be paid out in the amount of 4400.00, totaling \$8,000.00, for a grand total of \$30,000.00 being paid out. A total of 12 claims were denied for payment for various reasons. (Over the age limit when joining the Association, was not a member in good standings and failed to notify the Association with in the one year time limit per the IPA Constitution and By-Laws.)

A motion was made and seconded to accept the report. Motion carried.

Competitive Shoot Report: Vice President John Idleburg reported that the first shoot of the year was held on September 18th, 2015, where a total of 128 members participated. 3 new Active members joined. 4 shoots have been held in 2016, where 299 members attended to shoots. At these shoots, 4 New Active members joined, 4 renewal Active members, 3 new Association "B" members and 3 Associate "B" members signed up. This year, the Shoot, made a profit of \$2,067.79.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the report as read. Motion carried.

Sherwood Youth Camp board of Directors Report: See Attorney's report.

Auditing Report: Past President Ken Thomason reported that the Audit Committee meets at the IPA office on August 17th, 2016. All expenditures of the checking account were reviewed along with all receipts of purchases. All records and bookkeeping was found to be in order. Director Ed Hoes went over the Audit that was completed at the office by our CPA, Cygan Hayes, Ltd. Copies of the Audit were available to the members for their review.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the reports as read. Motion carried.

Public Relations/Awards Report; Vice President Robert Nichols reported that two Awards were approved by the Committee and Executive Board. A Citizen's Award was presented to Mr. James Vernon, where he saved the lives of 16 children at a public library from a man with a knife. A second Citizen's Award was presented to Dalton Sims, age 13, who while fishing with his father at a local fishing pond, observed a small girl (age 2) fall into to the pond. The 13 year old jumped into the pond, saving the little girl's life.

Motion was made and seconded to accept the report. Motion carried.

Constitution & By-Laws Report: No report as no changes were submitted to the committee.

Conference Report; Director Ed Hoes, thanked the members who attended this year's conference. He also thanked everyone who donated prizes to the men's and women's programs .Next year's conference will be held on September 15th & 16th, 2017 at the Holiday Inn Gurnee Convention Center. Room rates will be \$99.00 per night, plus tax for either single or double. Next year is an election year, so he hopes everyone will attend.

Motion made and seconded to accept the report. Motion carried.

Special Membership Report: No report.

Membership Report: Vice President Joe Feulner reported that he has spoken with various departments about joining the Association.

Special Olympics Report; Vice President Robert Nichols reported that he attended the annual "Kickoff" on February 12th, 2016. This year, we celebrated the 30th, anniversary of the Illinois Torch Run. 2015 proved to be another record year for the Torch Run program, as we enjoyed a \$300,000 increase in our fundraising efforts and raised \$4.1 million. Special Olympics are a global organization that unleashes the human spirit through the transformative power and joy of sport, every day around the world. Bob reported that he has traveled the State to division meetings and other functions where he has sold Law Enforcement torch Run T-shirts, hats and pins as well as Harley Davidson motorcycle tickets.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the report. Motion carried.

Law Enforcement Report; Robert Madura reported that at this year's memorial two current and six historic names were added to the memorial. The committee has met 6 times since the last annual conference. Bob thanked Past President Sue DaRif and Past President Larry Kearns for all of their hard work and dedicated service to the Memorial Committee.

Motion made and seconded to accept the report. Motion carried.

Scholarship Committee Report: Director Ed Hoes read the report from Chairman Mike Jackson. Six scholarships were awarded this year. The winners were:

Many Police Officers and the General Public do not fully realize the history of the ILLINOIS POLICE ASSOCIATION since 1901. The IPA continues to represent the individual police officer in this State in the related field of law enforcement.
