On behalf of the members of the IPA, I want to wish everyone a Happy New Year. The new year is already starting out with a bang with the Safe T Act going into effect January 1st, 2023, and the passing of the Assault Weapons Ban.

The IPA has several new projects that are going to help our members this year.

The first being our license Plate Bill being amended. This bill was first passed back in 2008, the proceeds going to our Death Benefit for our officers killed in the line of duty and for scholarships for family members whose spouse were killed in the line of duty death. Because of the lack of payments not being paid out, the bill had to be amended to include natural causes for our members. Past President Sue DaRif, volunteered to take on this task. With the help of State Rep. Lance Yednock and State Senator Patrick Joyce and Sue's had work and dedication, Sue was able to have get bill amended and goes into effect January 1st, 2023. The bill now includes death benefits for our members of the line of duty, natural cause death, scholarships and for non -members of the IPA who are killed in the line of duty only. (Thank you, Past President Sue DaRif, for all you had work. Certain members of our board should learn a lesson from you.)

Sherwood Charities will take effect January 1^{st} ,2023, This program will allow the Divisions to contribute donations to various charities each year along with donations to various other organizations and groups. Applications will be mailed within the next several weeks. For more information, contact the IPA office or any member of the committee.

Our annual conference will be held at the Crowne Plaza Hotel and Conference Center in Springfield on September 22 and 23, 2023. Room rates are \$96.00 per night with tax.

This is an election year for the State offices. Anyone wanting to run for re-election and run for a position on the State board must have his or her letter of intent into the office no later than March 15th, 2023. Any letter received after the 15 of March will NOT be accepted and the member will have to be nominated and elected off the conference floor. (If you are NOT going to run for re-election, please let the office know of this also.)

Anyone wanting to submit a proposal by-law change must have their proposal into the office no later than July 15th, 2023.

Other topics on the agenda during the conference will be membership. There has NOT been a membership report given at last year's conference or even State Board Meetings for over a year. WHY? During one of the Executive Board Meeting, last year, a motion was made to hold off with the Shoots for the rest of the year, so that the Shoot committee can investigate new shooting ranges. As of this date, update has been given o the board. WHY? If no action has been done in looking into new shooting ranges, a motion is going to be made to stop the shoot program. It is a waste of time and money to keep the program going.

It should be an interesting year coming up and I hope you will be around to see the fireworks. For those who are dedicated to the IPA, Thank You., I appreciate your challenging work and devotion to the Law Enforcement family and to the Illinois Police Association.

Happy New Year Everyone

Hard to believe that it has been 23 years since Y2K. I guess it is a sign of being old when New Year's 2000 seems like a couple of years ago. "Say La Vie" as they say.

In my last column and at the December executive board meeting, I asked for Ideas for a name for this column. I also asked for any ideas as topics to discuss. There were no suggestions for a new name so I will keep "Kitchen Table" temporarily for the time being.

As to ideas for topics-nothing there either. However, at the executive board meeting, attendees seemed to be interested in the new Safety Act, especially the no bail provision. This meeting was December 6th and just the day or two before changes were made to the act at the request of law enforcement. None of the changes removed or significantly altered the no cash bail aspect of the Safety Act.

A group of State's Attorneys led by DuPage County's Bob Berlin brought action in the State Circuit Court to this new act as unconstitutional. The Circuit Court found the act unconstitutional. The Illinois Attorney General filed a motion to address this ruling in the State Supreme Court on December 31. The Supreme Court put a stay on the implementation of the act until further notice.

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So, as of January 1st, we still have cash bail and will have cash bail until the Court rules.

At this point, I cannot guess what is going to happen to "No Cash Bail", but I imagine there will be some kind of compromise.

My legal tip of the day:

This goes out to all of us senior citizens who are of sound mind and able to make financial decisions for ourselves. At some point in the future this will not be the case. While we are able minded, we should consider preparing a Power of Attorney for financial decisions. The document's name is self-explanatory. The premise is to nominate a person (usually a son or daughter) that you trust to "stand in your shoes" and perform all your financial needs for you that you can not do for yourself anymore.

Ed Hoes was presented with the Lifetime Achievement Award for his dedicated years of service.



In 1994 the IPA Board decided to implement the annual scholarship award program. There were two dominant reasons for this decision:

- 1. To offer a recruitment incentive to prospective new members of the Illinois Police Association.
- 2. To reward our current members for their continued commitment and support for the organization.

On January 16, 2004, the Scholarship Committee held a meeting and reviewed the guidelines of the program. These guidelines were approved by the IPA Executive Board on April 6, 2004 to administer the program in a more efficient and effective manner for the benefit of our membership.

This information is being published to educate applicants and as a guideline for division officers during their review and processing of all required documentation.

All division chairmen will receive a copy of these guidelines and are expected to follow them to that their applicants receive proper consideration for the award. Any and all questions regarding eligibility should be directed to the corresponding division chairman. The scholarship committee of the Illinois Police Association will ultimately review all submitted applications for compliance and has the final decision regarding the awarding of scholarship funds.

The scholarship committee has worked hard to ensure the success of this ongoing program and asks that the following rules are strictly followed. Thank you for your consideration.

Eligibility:

- 1. A child (natural or legally adopted), regardless of residency, of an Active or Active Paid Up life member or a stepchild who resides in the same household of the IPA member. The applicant must be under the age of 24 as of November 1 of the corresponding scholarship year.
- 2. The member must be in good standing with the IPA for least one year prior to the date of application.
- 3. The scholarship applicant must be a full time student carrying a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester or an equivalent number of hours per quarter In an undergraduate capacity.
- 4. Full time nursing students who meet the above criteria are eligible to apply.

Persons who are not eligible:

- 1. IPA members or spouses.
- 2. Students in a trade, industrial or graduate school.
- 3. Part time students carrying less than 12 credit hours per semester or an equivalent number of hours per quarter.

Eligibility will be predicated upon each division's roster of Active or Active Paid Up life members as of

May 1 of the

current year. No transfer of members to a different division will be made within 12 months prior to the deadline for application submissions (November 1 of each year) for the purpose of benefiting in the scholarship award program. Applicants may apply to only one division.

Scholarship Expenditures:

- 1. The current award will be \$500.00 per school year per student. Each eligible student in a family may apply.
- 2. Award winners may reapply annually.
- 3. The Illinois Police Association, Inc. will remit one lump sum payment of \$500.00 to award winner. The payment will be made after the division chairman submits the winning application with all necessary supplementary documentation to the IPA office. All winning applications will then be reviewed and ultimately approved by the scholarship committee.
- 4. Each of the13 divisions of the IPA will receive one scholarship annually (if so submitted) at a cost to the association of \$6,500.00

Procedure for Selection:

All applications will be collected and screened by each division for eligibility and the submission of all necessary documentation. After proper verification the division board will prepare the names of all candidates for a random drawing. The winner will be drawn by the chairman at a regular meeting of the division no later than the 30th day of November in the corresponding year. The chairman will also draw the name of the one alternate winner who will not be announced.

Should the announced winner be ineligible for any reason then the alternate be awarded the scholarship and announced at a later date. Divisions should retain all submitted applications in event that the alternate is also found ineligible and yet another winner may have to be selected.

The winning application with all supportive documentation will be forwarded to the IPA office by the division secretary no later than December 15. Pending the receipt of all documentation in a timely manner, announcements of the official winners will be made by the chairman of the scholarship committee at the earliest scheduled board meeting.

If any division fails to submit the name an eligible winner no scholarship will be awarded to said division. Winners of the scholarships will be eligible to reapply the following year.

Verification of Eligibility:

The following must accompany all applications:

- 1. A copy of the applicant's current class schedule.
- 2. A copy of an invoice or statement from the bursar's office indicating full or partial tuition payment.
- 3. A copy or printout of a financial instrument electronic or other document showing full or partial tuition payment.


